Only one flare is observed so far, 1944 Sep. 12. The observed range is 14<sup>m</sup>.5 - 15<sup>m</sup>.5, but may be considerably more than 1 magnitude with regard to the long exposure time. Several plates show an increase of about 0<sup>m</sup>.5. The comparison of plates from 1945 and 1930 revealed a considerable proper motion of 1" per year in the position angle 64°. A chart will be given in *Astronomische Nachrichten* Vol. 290 p. 43 ff. The object is recommended for a determination of the parallax.

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
